The explosion occurred around the time of 9:02 A.M. on the date of April 1995. One hundred and sixty eight people were lost that day including nineteen children. A truck containing a mixture of diesel fuel and plant fertilizer, exploded in front of the Murrah Building. Timothy McVeigh was tried and convicted of bombing a federal building; his sentence was that of death. Even though many will remember the sadness of that day will be remembered forever, with all hope the goodness of the people that stood up that day will shine through.

The Oklahoma people after the attack came together and provided aid throughout the city. They provided food for the responders that were responding to the scene and joined in the efforts to rescue those still under the rubble. Others gave blood to help bolster the reserves of the hospitals in the area. These people showed that you do not necessarily have to be a professional to help people.

Those today should take inspiration from those who stepped up and took initiative in the case of the tragedy that was the Murrah Building Bombing. Those who died that day will always be remembered.
