30TH ANNIVERSARY APRIL 19 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY

Media credentialing for the April 19 Remembrance Ceremony is required.

Please fill in the names and information of those covering the Remembrance Ceremony at memorialmuseum.com/credentials.

The deadline to apply for credentials is Friday, April 11 at 5:00p.m.

Media credentials, provided by the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum, must be worn at all times while covering the event. Media credentials, for those who have applied and been approved, may be picked up after 6:00 a.m. on April 19 on the Memorial grounds. Media credentials and a yellow Media vest must be worn by those carrying a backpack for live purposes. Media vests will be provided by the Memorial after 6:00 a.m. on April 19. All backpacks must be swept by law enforcement.

All equipment needed for coverage must be with you at the Survivor Tree no later than 7:00 a.m. for the law enforcement sweep. Everyone must remain at the Survivor Tree until the Remembrance Ceremony concludes. After 7:00 a.m., Media cannot relocate or roam the grounds until after the Remembrance Ceremony concludes. No additional equipment will be admitted to the site after the security sweep by law enforcement.

The Remembrance Ceremony will begin at 8:30 a.m. President Bill Clinton is the keynote speaker. 168 seconds of silence will be observed and family members will read the names of the 168 people killed.

Risers and tables/chairs at the Survivor Tree are provided to the media on a first come basis. A mult box will be provided by Edge production company at the Survivor Tree.

The Pool Camera is being provided by KFOR-TV and will be fed to Nexstar space on Galaxy 16 KU. A test window will be provided by KFOR the week of April 14. Details will be announced.

The KFOR truck has 12 outputs, SDI out with embedded audio on a first come basis. The live stream is also being provided by KFOR and will include the KFOR logo. KFOR'S truck will be parked on Robinson and NW 5th, near the Survivor Tree path. The KFOR truck/pool distribution is the only vehicle to be parked on Robinson.

Following the ceremony, media is welcome to visit the Field of Empty Chairs.
